Tribes celebrate fish warriors and Boldt decision's 50th anniversary

More than 500 people gathered Feb. 6-7 at the Muckleshoot Events Center to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Boldt decision which reaffirmed tribal treaty fishing rights and recognized tribes as co-managers of fisheries.

Several Quileute Tribal members participated.

"It brought many memories back of how we had to fight for our families and what was right to take care of -- our treaty and our entirety," said Bonita Cleveland Reames, who works for the Northwest Indian Fisheries Commission and is also Chairwoman of the Quileute Natural Resources Fish Committee. "We have been caretakers of the waters. Take care of the waters, and they will always take care of us. ...That's the teachings from time immemorial. The house was full of a lot of great words, yet I felt it was bigger than what we could really get out of two days. Sure brought back memories, and my most favorite was hearing Billy's voice and seeing old fish warriors."



The event was held at Centralia College. Each student played five rounds during the day, and most games lasted about an hour.

QTS math teacher Scott Jackson runs an open classroom for chess time during the morning, and serves as the team's coach. "Every student who went won at least one game," Jackson said. "We got 10th place as a team and Forks got 9th place, but we needed 7th to go to state."
